When I first arrived here in 2014, I was told the roof was 20 years old and needed to be replaced sooner rather than later. The last 10 years have been spent raising money and repairing leaks. I am happy to announce that we have locked in a bid from Rain Remodeling and Restoration, Inc. to replace the roof for just over \$100,000.

Through your pennies, other contributions to the roof fund, and a generous donation in memory of Chuck and Ouina Johnston, we have raised \$38,265.

If you feel led to donate to the roof fund, there is still time. The work will begin early in 2025 when the weather permits. But we would like to thank everyone for their generosity and patience while the Trustees and Ad-Council tackle this large project.
