On December 23, 2025, the Staff-Parish Relations Committees (SPRCs) of Trafford Trinity and Manor First received very unexpected news from District Superintendent, Rev. Paul Ritchey. Pastor Angelique is being placed on medical disability to care for the condition of her eyesight. Her service as our pastor ended December 31, 2025.

Following the December 28 worship service, our joint SPRC met Pastor Steven McIlvaine. Pastor Steven has been appointed as our part-time pastor for the Trafford: Trinity/Manor: First Charge from January 1 to June 30, 2026. In July, we hope to have a full-time pastor appointed again to our churches. Pastor Steven will be in the pulpit every Sunday and will be available to serve us on Mondays as much as possible. He will be introducing himself to us during Sunday worship on January 4.

In Pastor Angelique's sermons on both Christmas Eve and December 28, she encouraged those of us who have known Jesus as our Savior for many years, to open our hearts and receive fresh insight, purpose, and joy from the Holy Spirit. She urged those who have not yet asked Jesus to be their Savior to ask Him now. This is the very best way to begin the new year!
