Trinity continues to collect plastic grocery bags and plastic shopping bags to make mats for the homeless. We have five mats and one pillow ready to deliver to the group that distributes the items. A mat and pillow are on display on the pew which is beside the church library.

Thanks to everyone who has helped with this program so far. Please continue to bring in your empty bags and place them in the box at the back of the sanctuary.

We plan to hold another training session in early spring. If you want to learn the process of mat-making, or if you want a refresher on the process, please plan on attending. We will announce a date later this month.

Homeless Kits

Trinity continues to assemble and distribute homeless kits. Pick up a kit or two and keep them in your vehicle. When you encounter a homeless person during your travels and the opportunity presents itself, offer a kit to the individual.

Each homeless kit contains one pair of socks, one pair of winter gloves or an 8-oz bottle of water (depending on the season), two body wipes, five snack-size Slim Jims, and \$5.00. You'll find the kits in the overflow area off the sanctuary. The kits now are in wire baskets, one for men and one for women. What's the difference between the kits? The socks we purchase are sized for men and women, therefore different kits.
